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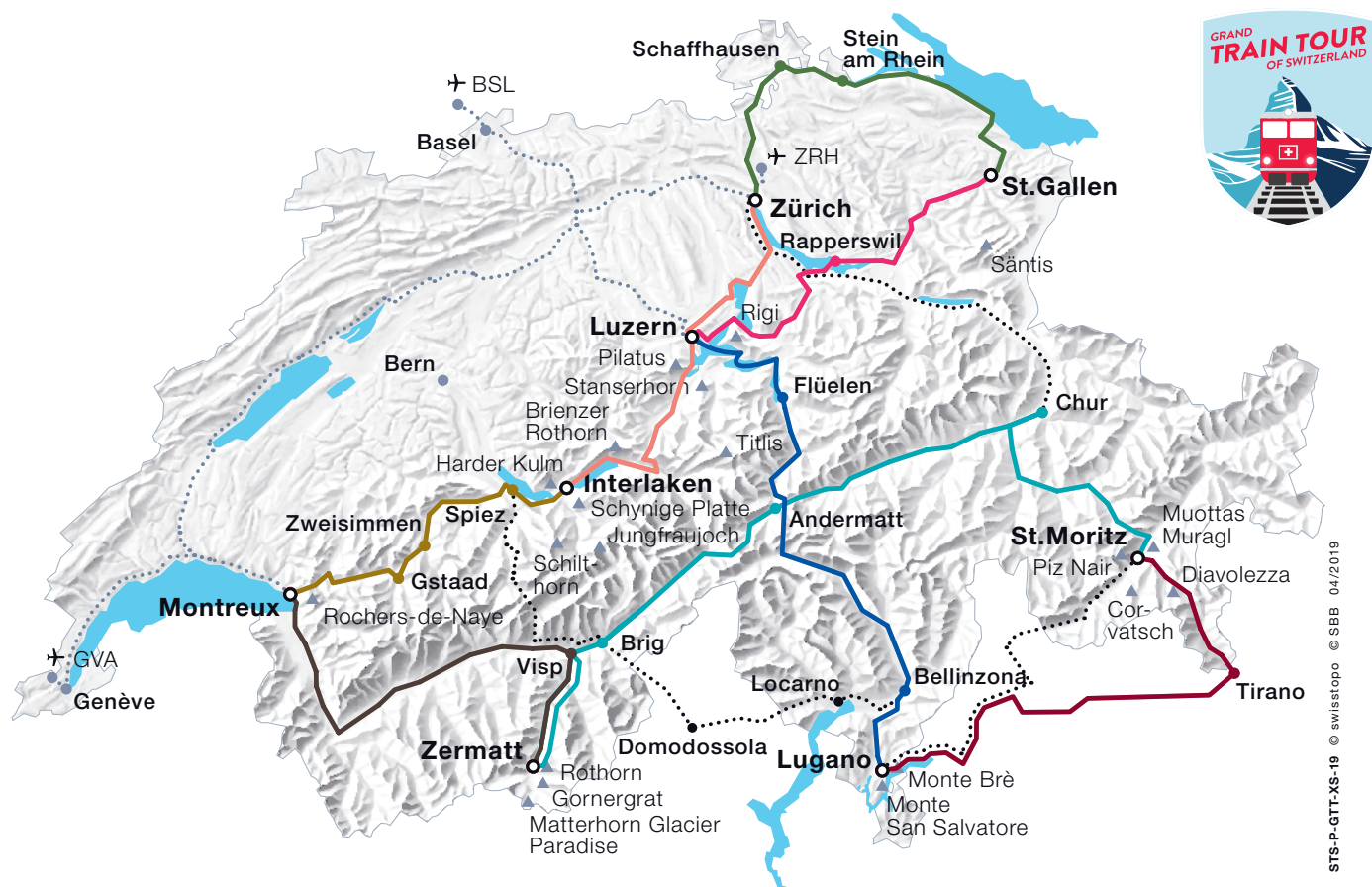
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The Grand Train Tour in brief.

On this tour, travellers discover all the highlights of the Alpine nation.

Exploring all sights and landmarks Switzerland has to offer from the comfort of the train. Just like in a theme park. But for real. The Grand Train Tour of Switzerland merges the most beautiful panoramic lines into one unique route of 1,280 kilometres. There is no prescribed direction or duration. Travellers can hop on and off wherever they please. The Grand Train Tour of Switzerland is also a perfect companion for many mountain excursions.

The eight sections of the Grand Train Tour of Switzerland.

The great train experience is arranged in several route sections offering different focuses. Thus, Switzerland's entire diversity is made accessible and comes alive. Each stretch promises thrilling railway adventures, magnificent scenery and numerous opportunities for discovery.

Section 1: From Zurich to Interlaken

On the ride from Switzerland's largest urban centre to Lucerne, sparkling lakes and gentle hillsides dominate the scenery. Particularly the ride on the Luzern–Interlaken Express is amazingly beautiful for nature lovers – thanks to a magnificent mountain panorama and countless waterfalls.



Section 2: From Interlaken to Montreux

Starting from Interlaken, guests first glide along Lake Thun and then through the Simmen Valley to Zweisimmen. Here, the GoldenPass Panoramic takes over. The Premium panoramic train gently takes its passengers from Zweisimmen towards Montreux. It runs past magnificent castles as well as peacefully grazing cattle and finally passes the German-French language border. On the last leg, it winds down through the hills – and with the arrival at Montreux visitors become engrossed in the Mediterranean flair of the region.

Section 3: From Montreux to Zermatt

Valley after valley. From the Rhone Valley the ride continues through the Nicolai Valley, Switzerland's deepest-incised valley. On its way from Visp to Zermatt and the famous Matterhorn, the Matterhorn Gotthard Railway has to overcome all of 900 metres in altitude.



Section 4: From Zermatt to St. Moritz

The Glacier Express travels over the Alps and connects fashionable Zermatt with the equally glamorous St. Moritz. Ceiling-high panoramic windows offer unobstructed views of imposing mountainscapes, deep ravines and picturesque valleys – scenic splendour at its finest.

Section 5: From St. Moritz to Lugano

By the time the first glaciers sparkle through the train windows after Morteratsch, few passengers remain in their seats on the fire red train. On the Bernina Express ride down towards Tirano, one highlight follows the next. No end of scenic beauty can also be experienced on the Bernina Express Bus to Lugano.



Section 6: From Lugano to Lucerne

The Gotthard Panorama Express presents one of the most diverse sides of Switzerland: The 1st class panoramic train takes guests from the Mediterranean-style Ticino along the historic Gotthard Line to Flüelen. There, passengers change to a steam boat or motor vessel and leisurely cruise towards Lucerne.



Section 7: From Lucerne to St. Gallen

It starts at Lake Lucerne against the backdrop of the prominent Alpine panorama of Central Switzerland: the Voralpen-Express. The ride offers views of spectacular peaks followed by the lake dam Rapperswil with a view of the castle and the lake and the Sitter Viaduct – Switzerland's highest railway bridge.



Section 8: From St. Gallen to Zurich

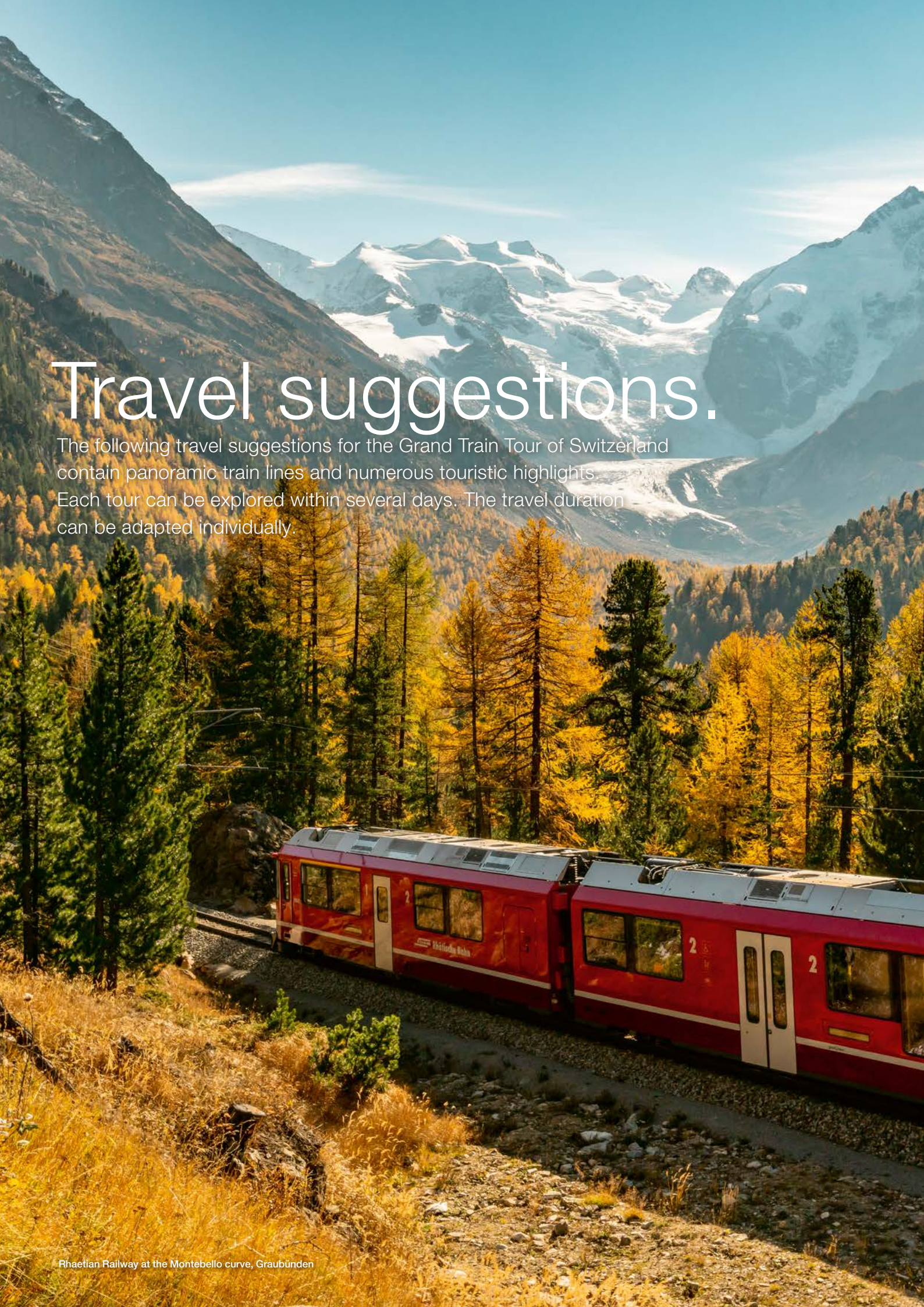
The stretch from St. Gallen to Zurich has the element water as its central theme. Together with Lake Constance and the Rhine, the spectacular Rhine Falls never fail to conjure amazement on visitors' faces. Thanks to the semi-circular routing, passengers get a perfect view of Europe's largest waterfalls right from the train.

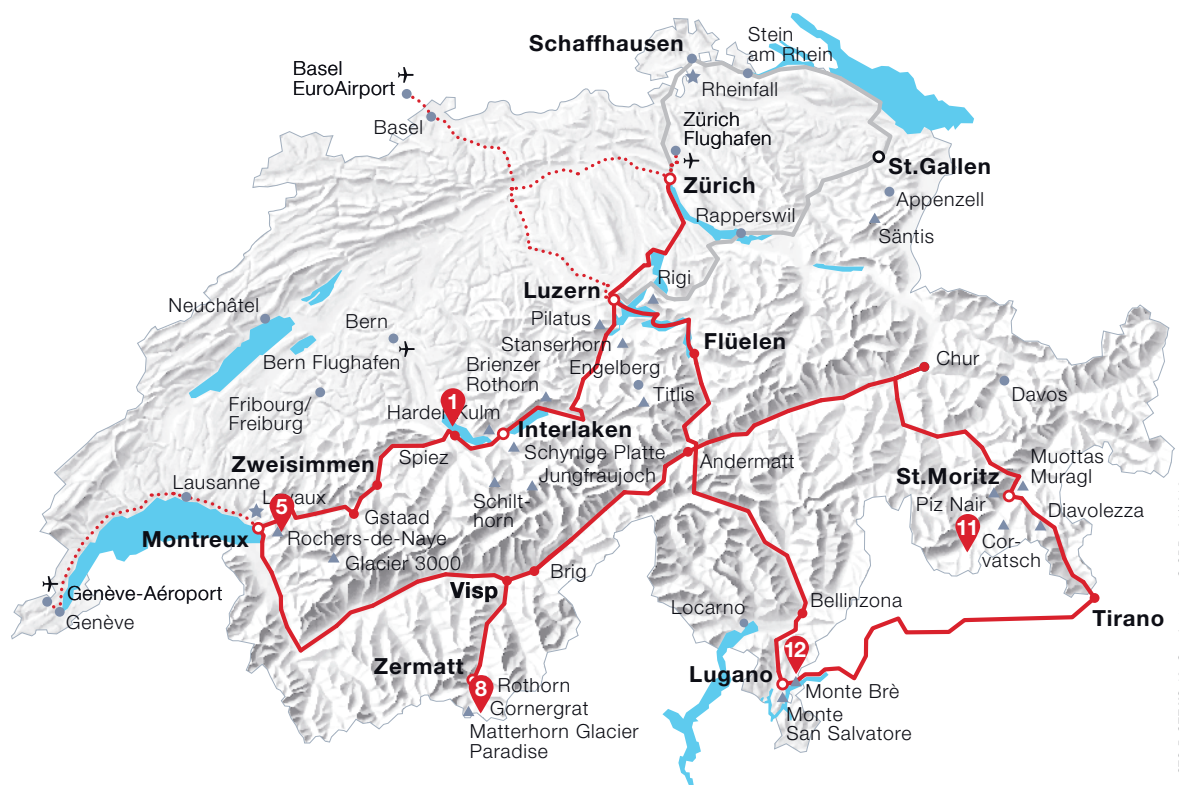

Bernina Express near Morteratsch, Grisons

“Glaciers & Palm Trees” tour.

This tour delivers on its promises: Starting from temperate regions, the train climbs up to more than 2,000 metres altitude. First, imposing glaciers take turns with sparkling mountain lakes in front of the ceiling-high windows. Shortly afterwards, the train winds its way down to Italy, where guests can continue to Lugano by bus – immersing themselves in a little “dolce vita” before tackling the historic Gotthard Line back to Lucerne.

“Hidden Treasures” tour.

This route bridges two cultures: From the urban centre of Zurich, the “Hidden Treasures” tour leads over the picturesque, lesser-known Lötschberg Line down to “Bella Italia”. The journey continues comfortably from Domodossola through the Centovalli, the “100 valleys”, and then along the historic Gotthard Line back to the German-speaking part of Switzerland. Three days of urban charm, rolling countryside and Mediterranean grottos – semplicemente perfetto, simply perfect!

All highlights at
a glance.





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1 Turquoise lakes.



Interlaken sits in a unique location between Lake Thun and Lake Brienz, right at the foot of the imposing “big three” Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau. For many visitors this town is destination and starting point of long-cherished vacation dreams. Adventures are guaranteed: Paragliding, jetboat riding or river rafting are just a few among the many outdoor activities in Interlaken's stunningly beautiful natural surroundings.

2 Mountain excursions Jungfrau region.



From Interlaken, the Jungfraujoch, Harder Kulm, Schynige Platte and Schilthorn are all just one breathtaking train ride away. All of them are captivating alright. The Jungfraujoch impresses with Europe's highest railway station (3,454 m a.s.l.), the imprint of James Bond can be found on the Schilthorn, and the Harder Kulm offers a view of the two lakes nestling between the mountains. Those are the superlatives of the Interlaken region.

3 Open-air museum Ballenberg.



A journey to the origins of Switzerland: Ancient Swiss farmhouses have been carefully taken apart at their original location and rebuilt at the open-air museum Ballenberg. More than 100 witnesses of the past have been assembled that way. However, the Ballenberg is actually more like a village than a museum: Visitors can participate in one of many handicraft workshops such as clay oven construction or horsehair braiding.

4 Chillon Castle.



It is one of the first sights that catches the eye of every visitor of Montreux: the magnificent Chillon Castle at the shores of Lake Geneva. In the 12th century, it was used as a strategic check point for passengers between the northern and southern parts of Europe. Nowadays, its doors are open to interested visitors. This attraction is easily accessible on foot, by train, bus or boat.

5 Rochers-de-Naye.



Right at the heart of Montreux sits the lower terminal of the cog railway up to the Rocher-de-Naye. At a leisurely pace, the train passes charming houses and splendid palaces, granting lovely views of Lake Geneva from various perspectives on its way to the summit. There, guests are greeted by whistling marmots in summertime – and by Father Christmas himself in the winter. In the warmer months, a visit to the Alpine garden is of course a real must.

6 UNESCO Lavaux Vineyard Terraces.



They can be seen from the train from far away, the vineyards protected by UNESCO. Especially at sunset, the combination of the lake waters and the south-facing slopes covered in vines is ravishingly beautiful. Highly recommended for those who know how to appreciate the good things in life.

7 Matterhorn view.



Many people know Zermatt for its most famous landmark: the Matterhorn. Apart from the “Horn”, as the mountain is affectionately dubbed by the locals, beautiful timber chalets as well as luxurious hotels adorn the village, which is quite popular with a more affluent clientele. For, nestled in the Zermatt mountainscape, not only hiking, biking and skiing but also shopping, dining and drinking Champagne are the order of the day here.

8 Gornergrat.



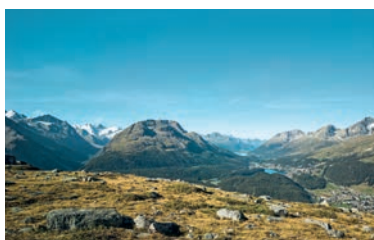
Surrounded by no fewer than 29 4,000-metre peaks, the Gornergrat (3,089 m a.s.l.) offers an unforgettable 360° panorama. It provides the most beautiful view of the Matterhorn and Europe's third-longest glacier. After a mere 33 minutes' ride from Zermatt, the view opens onto a mountainscape that couldn't be more magnificent. The hike to Lake Stellisee is highly recommended. Here, the Matterhorn is impressively reflected on the water's surface – a perfect photo spot.

9 Matterhorn Glacier Paradise.



The panorama is unique: the largest glaciers of the Alps as well as a total of 38 breathtaking Italian, French and Swiss Alpine giants. Visitors are at 3,883 metres altitude and very close to Italian territory. Here, they look at the “beautiful rear” of the world-famous Matterhorn. Below lies Europe’s biggest summer skiing area, open 365 days a year.

10 Muottas Muragl.



A visit to the local mountain of St. Moritz is worthwhile, in summer as well as winter. In addition to a great view of the Engadine lake district, the Muottas Muragl also offers numerous hiking trails. On the “trail of philosophers” and the winter hiking trail, for example, visitors follow great thinkers, who once created their poems and paintings here.

11 Upper Engadine lake district.



So beautiful it looks almost surreal: The lake plateau between Maloja and St. Moritz characterises the image of the Engadine scenery. It is recreational paradise and picture-perfect postcard scene all rolled into one. Travellers on the Grand Train Tour of Switzerland best explore the magnificent, deep blue Engadine lakes on a lake hiking tour or a leisurely stroll along the shoreline. Apart from the four large, well-known valley lakes, many smaller mountain and moor lakes in the forests or higher up are tempting destinations as well.

12 LAC Lugano.



Attention art lovers! In Lugano, right at the lake, a new cultural asset has opened its doors: the LAC Lugano Arte e Culture. The cultural centre mainly focuses on the fine arts, performing arts and music. The many temporary exhibitions, events and theatrical productions guarantee an exciting experience every time.

13 Monte Brè.



This nature experience starts right in the heart of Lugano. Into the Funi, changing to the second Funi, panoramic view: Only a few minutes of travelling take visitors from the city centre into pristine nature. The Monte Brè not only offers a spectacular panoramic view but also functions as a perfect starting point for many hiking and biking tours.

14 Food & wine in the south.



Yum... Wine from sun-kissed vineyards and dishes “della nonna”: Lugano offers lovers of good food a diverse Italian culinary experience. The locals have even devoted a special tour to this passion: On the Food & Wine Tour, typical specialities from the Canton of Ticino together with delicious, bright red Merlots can be sampled. For a more individual experience, the Grotti Tour can be booked. Here, a boat takes guests to a Grotto of their choice.

15 Chapel Bridge.



Lucerne thrives on the contrast between history and modern age. Especially the Chapel Bridge, built in 1356, with its prominent water tower characterises the cityscape of Lucerne. Tourists and locals alike admire this wooden construction and have made it their No 1 photo subject. What makes it so special? Its carefully designed decoration showing a beautiful picture cycle.

16 Mountain excursions Lucerne region.



Lake Lucerne is surrounded by the prominent mountains of the Central Switzerland Alpine panorama. Rigi, “Queen of the mountains”, Pilatus with the world’s steepest cog railway, and Titlis with the Rotair cableway are known well beyond the borders of Switzerland. The Stanserhorn with the CabriO cableway, unique in the world, also counts among the mountain highlights of the Swiss heartland. How wonderful that these mountain excursions can be combined with a delightful boat cruise.

17 Verkehrshaus – Swiss Museum of Transport.



It takes at least a full day to discover and explore everything there is to see at the Swiss Museum of Transport: From aviation and space travel to railway traffic and cableways to seafaring – all in an interactive exhibition. To cap it off, a visit to the IMAX cinema is in order: Thanks to the biggest screen in Switzerland (500 m²), visitors can literally immerse themselves in the film.

18 UNESCO Abbey District.



Located right in the heart of the historic Abbey District is the oldest library of Switzerland, the “Stiftsbibliothek” (Abbey Library). Its priceless holding of books ranges from Irish manuscripts – dating back to the time of the 7th to the 12th century – to ivory tablets dating from the year 894. It’s no surprise then that the Abbey Library has been awarded UNESCO World Heritage status in 1983. The baroque library hall, which one is only allowed to enter with slippers, is open to interested visitors year-round.

19 Säntis.



This adventure mountain of Eastern Switzerland inspires with a magnificent view: From its summit, visitors can see Switzerland, Germany, Austria, Liechtenstein, France and Italy all at the same time. Against this backdrop, Säntis hiking tours in the “Appenzellerland” are truly highly recommended.

20 Munot.



The Munot Fortress towers high up on the hill and gives the medieval town of Schaffhausen its unique character. The building, dating back to the 16th century, is Schaffhausen’s uncontested landmark. The town itself is no less splendid: medieval house fronts, no fewer than 171 beautiful bay windows, winding alleys and comfortable street cafés invite visitors to linger.

21 Rhine Falls.



Over a width of some 150 metres, the roaring mass of water tempestuously thunders down. The Rhine Falls between Neuhausen and Laufen are the largest waterfalls in Europe and can be reached from the train stop “Neuhausen am Rheinfall” in a matter of minutes. On platforms and boats, visitors get to experience this natural spectacle from up close.

22 Great Minster.



It is truly impressive how the two 64-metres-high towers dominate the cityscape of Zurich. The Great Minster, a Protestant church, sits right in the centre of the old town. According to the oldest existing written records, its construction is believed to date back to the 8th century. Apart from its towers, the neo-Gothic dome of the Great Minster is also considered an architectural gem.

23 A diverse world of museums.



The Kunsthaus Zürich, with a collection of 4,000 paintings, statues and art installations, has ranked among Zurich’s most important cultural assets since 1787. About 100 years later, the Landesmuseum (National Museum) next to the Main Station opened its doors. The newest addition to the Zurich world of museums is the FIFA World Football Museum, where everything revolves around football (soccer) and how this sport inspires people around the world. An absolute must – even for football “poopers”.
